

Identify Common And Proper Nouns

A **common noun** is a noun that is used to represent a group of people, animals, places, or things. It does not name anything specific.

For example:

Holiday: It is a common noun that does not specify anything in particular.

A **proper noun** is a noun that is used to represent a specific person, animal, place, or thing.

For example:

Christmas: It is a proper noun that refers to a specific festival, that is, "Christmas."
