

Polish Last Names And Their Meanings



Bartosz

It is the Polish form of Bartholomew, which refers to the 'son of Talmai' or 'son of Furrows.' Bartholomew was one of the twelve apostles of Jesus.



Dubicki

A toponymic last name, Dubicki is derived from the name of a town called Dubica in Poland.



Gorecki

It is derived from the Polish word 'Gora,' which means a 'mountain.' Gorka is also the name of many towns in Poland, making 'Gorecki' a toponymic last name.



Kasprzak

It originates from the name Kasper/Kacper, which originates from an ancient Persian word 'Gizbar,' meaning 'treasurer.'



Mencher

It is an occupational Polish surname derived from the word 'maczarz,' which refers to a 'miller' or a 'flour dealer.'



Pokorny

It possibly originated in the Czech Republic and means 'humble.'



Sikora

It refers to a small bird called a 'titmouse.' The surname is derived from a nickname for a small and dark person.



Warszawski

Another toponymic last name, Warszawski refers to someone who belonged to the city of Warsaw situated in Poland.
