Corticosteroid (Budesonide)-containing nasal sprays

As a nasal decongestant Xylometazoline-containing nasal sprays

Oxymetazoline- or

Drawback: May cause rebound congestion if used for more than 5-6 days.

Norepinephrine



For prevention of hypotension during C-section

Advantages over phenylephrine: Less incidences of reactive hypertension and decreased heart rate.
