### DIFFERENTIAL DIAGNOSIS

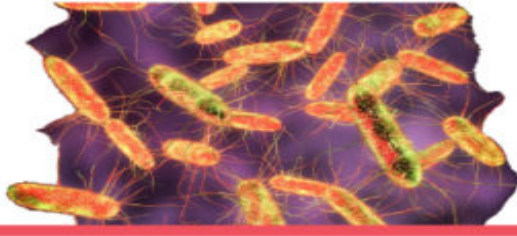

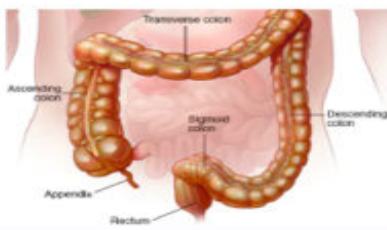
#### Campylobacter enterocolitis



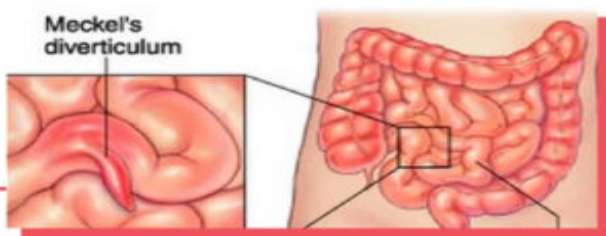
#### Salmonella enterocolitis



#### Antibiotic-associated colitis



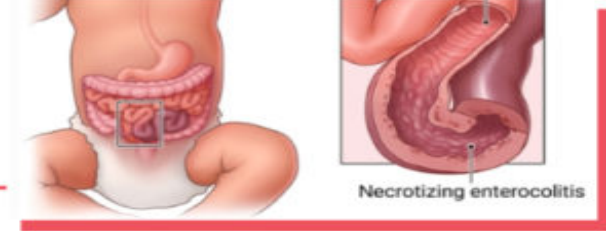
#### Meckel's diverticulum

#### Necrotizing enterocolitis



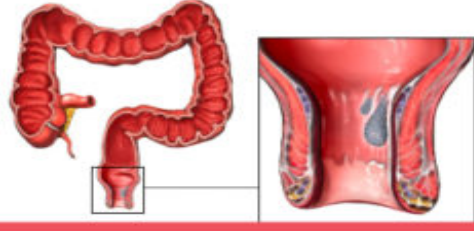
#### Chronic inflammatory bowel disease
