
TIPS TO STREAMLINE PLAYTIME FOR CHILDREN WITH Down Syndrome

Choose toys with simple rules and easy-to-play features, avoiding confusion.



Use toys such as peg boards and sorting games to enhance their fine motor skills.



Engage with the child while they play, rather than leaving them alone.



Let the child take the lead and demonstrate what they can do with the toy.



Tap on their visual learning skills by demonstrating the various ways to play with the toy.



Utilize a sensitive and supportive approach while guiding them instead of pressuring them.



Make playtime focused on hands-on activities to enhance the child's learning.
