Oral Immunotherapy (OIT)

In Cow's Milk Allergy (CMA)



Salient features of OIT for CMA

Minimal doses of the allergen are given over a long period until the child develops tolerance to the same.



The dose is increased first daily, then weekly or biweekly, and finally, a maintenance dose is given.



Treatment may continue for months to years, depending on the severity of the allergy.



Early intervention may produce better outcomes.



Drawbacks

Time-consuming procedure.



May cause severe allergic reactions in some cases.
