Senna

WITH THESE MEDS WHEN NURSING

DIGOXIN (LANOXIN)



Senna is a stimulant laxative that can lower potassium levels in the body, raising the likelihood of Lanoxin side effects.

ESTROGENS



Consumption of Senna can hinder the absorption of estrogens.

WARFARIN (COUMADIN)



Senna is a diarrhetic laxative. Warfarin side effects are amplified by diarrhea, which might result in bleeding.

WATER PILLS (DIURETIC DRUGS)



Senna and water pills together might induce critically low potassium levels.
